JOSÉ HERNANDEZ immigrated to Maryland from El Salvador at age 14. He attended Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) and applied to colleges and universities during his senior year. But like many of our students, José saw his dreams pushed out of reach by the high cost of tuition.


